
Union Center Fire Company joins forces with Be the Match and Preston's League in giving people a chance to save a life thru conducting a Bone Marrow Donor Drive

WHO: Preston is the nephew of Union Center Fire Captain Dennis Hill. He was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) in January of 2010 at the age of 2. He spent 155 days in the hospital enduring many rounds of chemotherapy and was declared in remission. In January of 2011 it was suspected that Preston was relapsing, it was confirmed in February and Preston has been in the hospital since that time and is currently receiving his third round of chemotherapy. The only chance that Preston has for survival is a bone marrow transplant, unfortunately as much as we all wanted to be his match; not one member of his family is a match for him. Heartfelt thanks go out to the bone marrow donors because the National Bone Marrow Registry was able to identify 3 "perfect" matches for Preston. If not for the people that have been willing to take the simple steps to place their marrow type on the registry, we would be losing this beautiful little boy. Now the doctors need to get his cancer into remission so that the bone marrow transplant can take place and hopefully be the cure for the rest of his life.
