WINDSOR HOUSE FIRE

Windsor firefighters were called to a house fire at 333 Old Route 17 on Monday, November 25, 2013 at 0800 hours. Upon arrival firefighters conducted a aggressive interior attack. Firefighters had a difficult job due to the residence being full of contents.

It was determined that cellar had heavy fire conditions. Command then made decision to change to exterior attack, pulling firefighters from building . Approximately 30 minutes later the floor in center of house collapsed. The owners of the structure were out of country on a vacation.

The house was a total loss, but Firefighters were able to save an attached garage behind the house. One firefighter was taken to Lourdes hospital suffering from smoke inhalation. No other injuries were reported. Windsor was assisted by west Windsor, Five Mile Point, Ouquaga, Deposit, Harpursville, and West Colesville Fire Companies. It appears that fire was started by an electrical problem and is being investigated by Broome Fire Investigators. Windsor was also assisted by Broome County Fire Coordinators Staff.
