Well Involved House Fire in the Town of Windsor

At approximately 12:30 on Friday January 29th, 2016 Great Bend Fire Department (Susquehanna County Pennsylvania) was dispatched to 62 Bell Road in the town of Windsor for a reported house fire. A postal service worker in the area had noticed the smoke and called in the fire. Command quickly confirmed a working fire and requested Mutual Aid.

Due to the extent of fire in the structure and information that no one was home at the time, fire attack was exterior only. Crews quickly knocked down the main body of fire but stubborn pockets of fire continued to burn for a length of time before crews could dig them out. Extensive overhaul had to

be done throughout the structure to completely extinguish the fire. The structure was almost a total loss and there was a partial collapse of the roof.

Broome County Fire Investigation Team was on scene conducting the investigation into the cause of the fire. Fire Departments on scene from Pennsylvania included Great Bend, Hallstead, Susquehanna, and Hartford. Fire Departments from New York included West Windsor, Windsor, Ouaquaga, Kirkwood, and Five Mile Point. Superior Ambulance provided a fire standby crew for the duration of the incident.
