Tactical Fireground Simulations - Pilot Course Opportunity

The Office of Fire Prevention and Control is seeking students to attend a pilot offering of the new 12 hour course Tactical Fireground Simulations. The pilot will be held at the NYS Academy of Fire Science in Montour Falls on December 10-11, 2016.

This course provides students with the ability to practice initial incident command functions on a fire emergency scene, utilizing real time computer based scenarios. It is not intended to teach command functions, but rather to reinforce theories previously learned and enable the student to practice in the command role. Through a series of computer simulations, students will serve as both a company level officer and initial incident commander.

In the first part of the course (approximately 3 hours) Concepts of Command will be reviewed including:

- management by objectives
- incident action planning
- · effective fireground communications
- incident size-up
- incident priorities
- · transfer of command
- firefighter may day
- review of building construction



Following the review, these concepts will be practiced, as the students assume the role of company officers in a series of real time computer simulations. These realistic scenarios will "react" to the officer's decisions, demonstrating the positive or negative results of their decision and how it affects the fire scene as a whole. Following each scenario a post incident analysis will be conducted. Students will receive a certificate of completion for the course.

All students will be expected to participate in a course critique at the conclusion of the course, offering both positive and negative feedback to assist OFPC with fine tuning the course.

There will be no cost for students selected to attend the course.

Pre-requisites: Students must have completed Firefighter 1 or equivalent. They should also have taken ICS 100, 200. Students that currently serve as a line officer may also attend, whether or not they have completed Firefighter 1.
